They have also recently planted tomatoes, cucumbers, and chilies, so stay tuned! Family Housing Hotel: Amigos expanded its services to include housing at Baymont Inn. Amigos will be able to provide stability for an

additional 50 families, including 9 refugee families from Colombia, as we work together to move each family into permanent housing. 


